JDVAC Educational Committee is excited to see everyone at this year's upcoming conference. This year's conference is led by **Ilana Glick** (Conference Chair), **Michele Gortemaker** (AVAA Past President), **Angela Day** (MAA President), and **Megan Duke** (Conference Co-Chair). Our team has been working hard over the past year to put keynote speakers that align with this year's conference theme: New Horizon's in Audiology: A Shore Bet.

Our conference kicks off on Monday, April 7th at 7:45am with announcements followed by our first keynote speaker at 8:00am. We will be starting the conference off strong with **Dr. Benjamin Hornsby** speaking about listening effort, and how hearing loss can relate to listening-related fatigue. Dr. Hornsby is an Associate Professor in the Department of Hearing and Speech Sciences at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. Monday morning is continued with Dr. Joshua Owen of the VA South Texas Healthcare System. **Dr. Owen** is going to speak about the integration of dermatology as a whole health factor with audiology and how the audiologist can play an integral role in early detection of skin cancer.

On Monday afternoon, **Dr. Sean McClenney**, our National Director of ASPS, will provide us with a review of FY24 and a vision for 2025. Following Dr. McClenney, will be our annual AVAA business meeting, which all VA audiologists are highly encouraged to attend (Reminder: All VA Audiologists are members of AVAA). The business meeting will include a review of AVAA from the past year, AVAA awards, as well as the announcement of the newest AVAA board members that will take their positions in June 2025.

Monday afternoon will conclude with **Dr. Ashley Zambetti**, and **Dr. Annabelle Thomlinson** sharing how they have integrated hearing service in the inpatient setting at their individual hospitals. We wrap up our day with **Dr. Jennifer Phelan** providing insight and guidance on clinical precepting. After our packed day of education and learning, do not forget to join us poolside for our Jersey Shore Social for good food, games, and music. You will not want to miss this event!

After a great night "on the shore", join us Tuesday morning for breakfast with the exhibitors. Our first keynote of the day will be discussing migraines in the audiology clinic with **Dr. Samuel Bittel**. Following this keynote, **Dr. Lindsey Jorgensen** will discuss evidence-based practice with hearing aid fittings and verification measures. The exhibit hall will be open throughout the day to meet, mingle, and learn from all our vendors, as well as to check out all the poster presentations for additional CEUs.

Following lunch, our joint session with be an update to the VA/DOD Clinical Practice Guidelines for Tinnitus presented by **Dr. Tara Zaugg, Dr. Michele Spencer**, and **Dr. LaGuinn Sherlock**. They will be providing a one-hour keynote on important information for all audiologists. Following this session, our tinnitus specialists will be hosting a breakout session, that is a more in-depth workshop exploring these guidelines. Other breakout workshops that will be hosted Tuesday afternoon include, synchronous and asynchronous telehealth hands on telehealth training, Xander Captioned Glasses review, verification hands on session, as well as additional time to spend with the vendors and posters in the exhibit hall.

Tuesday we will come together again for a keynote presented by **Dr. Riley DeBacker** with a look into the future on how AI can play a role in hearing and balance. After a great day at conference, don't forget to take some time to check out the Atlantic City Boardwalk.



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



Want an authentic Italian Sunday family dinner? Clip these family recipes from **Dr.** Ashley Zambetti from the Pittsburgh VA. Original recipes were created by her great grandma. There were no measurements so Ashley has modified them slightly. Always remember to measure with your heart (especially the garlic)!

Traditional Red Sauce - careful it stains EVERYTHING

Ingredients:

2 large cans crushed or pureed tomatoes (my great grandma used homemade canned.... no idea how to do that) 1 small can of tomato sauce 2 cans of tomato paste 1 white onion 3 cloves of garlic 1 tbs of fresh parsley 1 tbs of fresh basil 1 tbs dried oregano 1 tbs stock concentrate 1 tbs salt 11/2 large can of water pepper Carrots OR tbs baking soda

Stock pot

Supplies:

Large oven safe frying pan Bowl Measuring cups/spoons

Preparation:

Dice onion super small (even grate) In the large stock pot - Sauté onions in a lot of olive oil for about 5 minutes until onions are translucent Mince 3 cloves of garlic and cook for about 30 seconds (until you smell it) Add tomato paste, stir and cook for about 2 minutes Add cans of tomatoes, sauce, water, and stock concentrate Stir Add spices Stir Add carrots or baking soda (it's to take out the acidity) Bring to simmer Go make those meatballs!











Meatballs

Ingredients: 1 lbs ground beef 1 lbs ground chuck 1 cup milk

1 cup bread crumbs 1 cup pecorino remano cheese a big spoon full of ricotta cheese 2 tbsp fresh parsley 2 cloves garlic salt and pepper 2 eggs (1 egg per lbs of meat)

Preparation:

Add ground meats to a bowl and mix lightly with a fork (you don't want to mix too much or they get tough) Add milk and mix with fork Add everything except the breadcrumbs and mix with fork initially then switch to vour hands Add breadcrumbs and mix with hands Make into golf balls Brown outsides in the large pan with olive oil Add to sauce and cook for about 20-30 minutes Last 10 minutes cook your preferred pasta (we always used rigatoni)

Garlic Chicken Strips



Stick of butter in an oven safe pan Add 1 tbs of garlic Take 2 lbs of chicken strips and dredge in flour seasoned with salt and pepper Lay the floured strips in the pan Cook on both sides until white on the outside (do not fully cook) Take strips out of the pan Add equal amounts of chicken stock and white wine (about a cup of each) Salt and pepper Add 1 tbs fresh parsley Cook for a bit (until alcohol is mostly gone) Add chicken back into a pan Cook in oven on 350 degrees for 20 minutes
